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TOPOFF3 Update

- OEP would like to thank everyone for their hard work and dedication in the preparation and execution of the TOPOFF 3 National Exercise. All acute care hospital TOPOFF 3 controllers are requested to submit their after-action reports (AARs) using the State of Connecticut Department of Public Health (DPH) AAR template attached to this briefing. Please email the AAR to DPH Drill Coordinator Jon Bergeson at jon.bergeson@po.state.ct.us and to Mukesh Roy at mukesh.roy@ynhh.org. Controllers should also ensure collection of data collector/evaluator logs used during TOPOFF 3 and send all completed logs to Mukesh Roy for submission to TOPOFF 3 officials. In addition, the TOPOFF 3 overview presented at this week's Southern Tier Hospital Emergency and Terrorism Preparedness Committee meeting is attached to this briefing. Once all information is received more specific after action plans will be developed for review and determination of next steps.

Influenza A (H2N2) Situation

- The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), U. S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), and the World Health Organization (WHO) are working with the College of American Pathologists (CAP) and other providers of proficiency testing panels to ensure that influenza A (H2N2) samples sent to laboratories in the U. S. and 17 other countries are destroyed immediately. The Influenza A (H2N2) samples sent out are similar to the A (H2N2) viruses that circulated in humans in 1957 at the beginning of the Asian influenza pandemic. Instructions for Monitoring Health of Laboratory Workers and for Destroying Influenza A (H2N2) Samples

- On April 13, 2005, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention issued a Health Advisory (<http://www.phppo.cdc.gov/HAN/ArchiveSys/ViewMsgV.asp?AlertNum=00227>) describing the inadvertent distribution of Influenza A (H2N2) samples to domestic and international laboratories and recommending that those samples be destroyed immediately. An update to the advisory provides instructions for 1) monitoring for and reporting influenza-like illness among laboratory workers who might have been exposed to the A (H2N2) samples and 2) destroying Influenza A (H2N2) samples by use of autoclaves, incineration, or chemical decontamination and can be viewed at: <http://www.cdc.gov/flu/han041505.htm>.

Emergency Credentialing Program

- One thousand one hundred thirty four (1,134) new volunteers representing all disciplines throughout the state have been recruited for the Emergency Credentialing Program (ECP), bringing the total number of healthcare volunteers, which includes physicians, dentists and midlevel practitioners to 2,780. Hospitals are encouraged to use part of their surge capacity budget to support the minimal resources needed at their institution for program recruitment and maintenance. In cooperation with JCAHO, a "Just In Time" training program template for hospital disaster volunteers is under development. The online training, "EM102 for Hospital Disaster Volunteers" is scheduled for release later this month. Brief meetings are being scheduled with the designated ECP contact person at each participating hospital to explain more about the program. International Congress on Disaster Medicine and Emergency Management

- The Yale New Haven International Congress on Disaster Medicine and Emergency Management will be held September 12-13, 2005 at the Omni New Haven Hotel, 155 Temple St., New Haven, CT. A pre-conference workshop, *Health Disaster Management Guidelines for Evaluation and Research in the Utstein Style*, and a post-conference National Disaster Life Support (NDLS) course will also be offered. The conference will provide hospital, pre-hospital, public safety, public health and emergency management professionals with information about: best practices in health emergency management, including healthcare and public health organizations; recent progress in clinical disaster medicine; lessons learned from recent international and national disasters; and latest research and development in disaster medicine and emergency management. Training/Education

- Thirteen thousand five hundred fifty four (13,554) personnel representing other healthcare delivery agencies in the southern tier of Connecticut have completed EM 101 or EM 102 as part of their emergency preparedness efforts.
- At the request of the State of Connecticut Department of Public Health (DPH), an electronic survey has been developed and distributed via email by YNHHS CoE to obtain the following information from acute care hospitals in the southern tier: 1) number of staff trained in the use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE); 2) number of staff trained in decontamination procedures; and 3) number of staff trained on the Incident Command System (ICS) or the Hospital Emergency Incident Command System (HEICS). - *Disaster Preparedness for School Nurses-Independent Study Course*, an awareness level course for school-based nurses, was developed as a collaborative effort between the Yale New Haven Health System Center of Excellence (CoE), Yale University School of Public Health, the Connecticut Partnership for Workforce Development and the National Association of School Nurses. This course will be piloted from April 25, 2005 through May 25, 2005 with 30 Connecticut-based school nurses and nurse supervisors. - Emergency Management 140, Incident Command Systems for Healthcare, an introductory level course, will be available through the YNHHS OEP online learning management system in early May. The course provides: 1) a 30-minute overview of the Incident Command System (ICS)/Hospital Emergency Incident Command System (HEICS); and 2) optional in-depth discussions of ICS/HEICS including downloadable action sheets and other forms that can assist in building a facility command structure. - National Disaster Life Support (NDLS) courses have been scheduled for the New Haven area.
